Need to save shots around the greens? Try these chipping techniques, which should help.

1. Chipping with a hybrid or fairway wood – Particularly good if you miss the 6th green to the right.

Location:

Approach this like you would a long putt, place the ball forward in your stance, position your weight even on both feet, grip down on your hybrid or fairway wood and make a shallow putting like stroke. The ball wont spin on landing and will run out towards the flag.

2. Use a wedge with less bounce This allows the leading edge to sit closer to the ground and skid across the top of the turf.

Points to Note

Slightly open your stance, position your weight more onto your front foot, keep your hands and wrists out of the shot and make a shallow swing keeping the sole of the club skidding across the turf through impact. This technique will work with any low bounce wedge.

3. Texas wedge

As the couch firms up and the leaf becomes finer, putting off the green is a great option.


Pulling the putter out from further off the green will give you a low-risk option for getting the ball on the green. A remarkably simple but effective tip for long range putting is keeping down over the ball for longer, and not lifting your head too soon. Like all clubs, a putter has a sweet spot that you need to

35 Windmill Drive Wainui 0992 New Zealand hit. Staying balanced and keeping your head down longer will improve your strike on the putter face and improve, distance control, ball roll and direction.

Fitting Studio

Titleist TSR1, TSR2, TSR3 Drivers and Fairway woods – We have the Flightscope Tour 3 back in the studio with the swing catalyst cameras up and running, we are having great success finding players more distance off the tee, this device measures ball and club speed and helps select the perfect piece of equipment to give you more distance. The ball speed gains generated with the Titleist TS1, TS2 and TS3 drivers can be seen easily and when being paired to a driver with the correct head design, loft, shaft flex along with the correct golf ball makes a big difference.



The new Pro V1 and Pro V1x golf ball is out now! The Pro V ball offers remarkable distance, soft feel for your short game and very low long game spin, which keeps the ball straighter, the members price per sleeve is \$22.50.

Wainui has fared well through the latest rain events (except for the 13th hole). Other courses like Napier Golf Club are facing a different




picture. As you can see by these pictures they have lost quite literally everything!




on with projects like the putting green and nursery, while we put back the pieces after these unprecedented rain events.


